

Why the consecration of the womb?

Why would someone need the consecration of the womb? What does it do? Who needs it and when do they need it? These are all questions to keep in mind while reading this chapter. There are some things still not explained about the Consecration of the Womb in this book.

The effect of the consecration is always subjected to the devotion of the parents involved because the child will be affected by the emotions of the mother and the sentiments she will have in regards to the surroundings she has been, is, and will be in during her pregnancy. The child will also be affected by the surroundings it will be in after it is born. The child will be soaking in the things it hears and feels as well as the connectivity of the spirit of those around it, and to a degree the condition of Humanity. These are the reasons we need to continually consider our actions, especially our actions towards our wives, children, brethren, their wives and children and all Humanity in general.
